NOTES:

- ¹ The MOLLE overshirt carrier and the ballistic nylon duty gear must always be worn together and ONLY in the Class "C" uniform configuration.
- ² Only the black Cordura nylon (Class "B" and "C") or MOLLE (Class "C") overshirt carrier can be worn over the pullover style sweater.

ADDITIONAL UNIFORM CONFIGURATION REQUIREMENTS

- The Class "A" uniform configuration, consisting primarily of wool garments, is the prescribed dress uniform and may be worn at any time of the year.
- The winter or summer uniform garments may be worn 1 May through 31 May and 1 October through 31 October, depending on temperature.
- Department members will adhere to **ONE** uniform configuration and **WILL NOT** mix items between classes or seasonal uniforms, unless specifically authorized by a supervisor or Department directive.
- The appropriate exempt member or incident commander may designate the uniform of the day for a specific unit, event, or other circumstance.
 - The short sleeve shirt, with an open collar, may be worn as an approved outer garment when the temperature reaches **70°F or above** or if the member is assigned to administrative duties within a police facility.
 - For the Class "B" uniform, the long sleeve shirt, with a necktie, may be worn at the member's discretion at any time of the year and worn as an approved outer garment when the temperature is **50°F or above**.
 - For the Class "C" uniform, the long sleeve shirt, with an approved turtleneck, may be worn as an approved outer garment when the temperature is between **50°F and 70°F**.
 - A winter or fleece jacket, with the appropriate neckwear, may be worn as an approved outer garment when the temperature falls **below 60°F**.
 - The trooper or knit cap may only be worn when the temperature falls **below 40°F**.
 - The sweater may be worn as an approved outer garment at the member's discretion at **any time of the year**.
 - The removable checkerboard cap band will be worn on the Round Crown Cap from **1 November through 30 April**.
