

The Tactical Review and Evaluation Division reviews reportable use of force incidents, firearm pointing incidents, foot pursuits, and search warrants involving members of the Chicago Police Department.

All Department members are entitled to certain due process and substantive rights derived from Department directives, collective bargaining agreements, state statutes and the Constitution of the United States of America.

The nature of Tactical Review and Evaluation Division reviews and the impact such reviews may have on a Department member must remain confidential and must not be disseminated to persons not entitled to such information. Each member of the Tactical Review and Evaluation Division is responsible for ensuring the confidentiality of matters reviewed by the division and any documentation, video, or recommendations derived from the review.

Tactical Review and Evaluation Division personnel will limit dissemination of information concerning incidents and their review only to those persons who are necessary to ensure compliance with Department directives and recommendations made by the division.

Tactical Review & Evaluation Division personnel will refrain from discussing division-reviewed incidents in non-secure areas, or areas to which persons other than members of the Tactical Review & Evaluation Division have access. Such non-secure areas include, but are not limited to, police building parking lots, elevators, hallways and lobbies, as well as the common areas open to persons not assigned to the division.

All documentation, audio, video, evidence, or recommendations must remain secure and may only be distributed with written permission of the Commanding Officer of the Tactical Review & Evaluation Division, or as necessary to provide feedback on use of force incidents via policy, training or equipment recommendations.
