The law provides that you are to be advised of the following:

1. You have the right to remain silent. If you choose not to remain silent, anything you say can be used as evidence against you in a court of law.
2. You have a right to consult with an attorney before answering any questions and you have a right to have an attorney present during any questioning.
3. If you cannot afford an attorney, you have a right to have an attorney appointed to represent you before any questioning begins. You also have the right to have the appointed attorney present with you during such questioning.
4. You have the right to discontinue answering any questions at anytime.

The law further provides that any admissions made in the course of any hearing, interrogation or examination may be used as a basis for charges seeking your removal or discharge from the Department.

NOTE: Rule 14 of the Chicago Police Department's Rules and Regulations prohibits making a false report, written or oral. Making a false report, may result in separation from the Chicago Police Department.
