parent or quardian, knowingly gives shelter to a minor, other than a mature minor who has been emancipated under the Emancipation of Minors Act, for more than 48 hours without the consent of the minor's parent or quardian, and without notifying the local law enforcement authorities of the minor's name and the fact that the minor is being provided shelter commits the offense of harboring a runaway.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Trafficking in Persons: a person commits trafficking in persons when he or she knowingly: (1) recruits, entices, harbors, transports, provides, or obtains by any means, or attempts to recruit, entice, harbor, transport, provide, or obtain by any means, another person, intending or knowing that the person will be subjected to involuntary servitude.: or (2) benefits financially or by receiving anything of value, from participation in a venture that has engaged in an act of involuntary servitude or involuntary sexual servitude of a minor. A company commits trafficking in persons when the company knowingly benefits financially or by receiving anything of value, from participation in a venture that has engaged in an act of involuntary servitude or involuntary sexual servitude of a minor (720 ILCS 5/10-9). If you suspect a child is a victim of human trafficking, call 911 and the Illinois Department of Children & Family Services (DCFS) Child Abuse and Neglect hotline at 1-800-252-2873.

ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF CHILDREN & FAMILY SERVICES (DCFS)

DCFS has the primary responsibility of protecting children through the investigation of suspected abuse or neglect by parents and other care givers in a position of trust or authority over the child. Call the 24-hour Child Abuse Hotline at 1-800-25-ABUSE (1-800-252-2873) if you suspect that a child has been harmed or is at risk of being harmed by abuse or neglect. If you believe a child is in immediate danger of harm, call 911 first. Your confidential call will not only make sure the child is safe, but also help provide the child's family the services they need to provide a safe, loving and nurturing home.

THE NATIONAL CENTER FOR MISSING & EXPLOITED CHILDREN (NCMEC)

The National Center For Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) maintains a dedicated mission to help find missing children, reduce child sexual exploitation, and prevent child victimization. The NCMEC works with families, victims, private industry, law enforcement, and the public to assist with preventing child abductions, recovering missing children, and providing services to deter and combat child sexual exploitation. SUPPORTING VICTIMS AND FAMILIES

For families with a missing or a sexually exploited child, the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) provides support services like crisis intervention and local counseling referrals to appropriate professionals. The Team HOPE program connects families with peers who have had similar experiences and can offer coping skills and compassion. When a missing child is recovered. families may be helped with the reunification process, including mental health services and travel assistance.
